#### Dr Jeremy Isaacs

National Clinical Director for Dementia and Older People's Mental Health

Consultant Neurologist, St George's Hospital and Kingston Hospital

Dr Jeremy Isaacs is an Honorary Reader in Neurology at St George's, University of London and Director of the Neurosciences Clinical Academic Group. His research focuses on functional cognitive disorders, dementia and related conditions, and he is the Specialty Research Lead for Neurological Disorders, Neurodegeneration and Dementia for the South London Clinical Research Network.

Dr Isaacs is a Consultant Neurologist at St George's Hospital, where he was Dementia Clinical Lead between 2010-2019, and Kingston Hospital, where he was Neurology Clinical Lead from 2014 to 2024.

Dr Isaacs's clinical and leadership roles at St George's led to him being appointed as Clinical Director of the NHS London Dementia Clinical Network from 2019 to 2024, where he led an extensive quality improvement programme. This included establishing the London Memory Service Network, memory service pathway redesign, championing joint working and multidisciplinary meetings between specialties, and designing and leading the first London and national memory service audits.
