Regional Hospital in Focus: Turning the spotlight on our local services

Barnet Hospital, Royal Free NHS Foundation Trust

Barnet Hospital is a 459-bed district general hospital which provides secondary care services for the second oldest population of all London boroughs.

What's happening at Barnet?

- TREAT (Triage and Rapid Elderly Assessment Team) clinic aims to provide a rapid
 access service to avoid an unplanned presentation of the older person (> 80 years) to
 the emergency department or an unplanned admission, through one-stop
 multidisciplinary assessment and diagnostics.
- Launch of Urgent Care Plan: We have recently transitioned from using Coordinate My Care (CMC) to Urgent Care Plan (UCP) electronic platforms to share Advanced Care Planning records with community stakeholders.
 UCP is a platform that serves the entirety of London, with 40+ NHS Trusts using UCP and is part of implementing the OneLondon vision (https://www.onelondon.online/).
 At Barnet, we hope that the accessibility of UCP via the Health Information Exchange (HIE), without the barrier of a further login, will facilitate the viewing, creation and updating of ACP records for our inpatients.
