## Policy and Communications Committee (PACC) Rep

We are seeking a new trainee rep for this important committee, which currently meets four times a year via Teams.

PACC is a key source of guidance and information on policy, and actively engages with stakeholders and policy makers involved in the care of the frail older patient. As the Trainees Council policy rep, you will take part in this work and feed in the views and thoughts of the trainees.

## **Sustainability Rep**

This is an exciting new role on the Trainees Council offering the opportunity to help promote examples of good practice in sustainability.
